

## DUAL CREDIT TECHNOLOGY CONSIDERATIONS

FOR STUDENTS: If you are enrolled in dual credit courses, please check with your instructor(s) well in advance to see what technology requirements they have for their course work. A simple email can accomplish this, and it might even look something like this:

Hello [teacher name],

I am enrolled in your [course name here] course through Bushnell-Prairie City High School as a dual credit student. My high school issues me a Chromebook as a primary computing device, but some programs aren't always compatible with that. Would you be able to provide guidance on what technology platforms and/or tools are required for completing this course so I can make plans with my school IT department?

Remember, when you're here at B-PC and scheduled for a dual credit course in the lab, you are allowed to utilize the iMac computers available. Check with Mrs. Allen to get one assigned to you for the semester. When you're at home, if the school Chromebook isn't sufficient, you're responsible for using a personal computer to complete course work.

If you ever have special technology needs through a dual credit course, please contact Miss Settles and Mrs. Webb well in advance of this need so we can discuss possible solutions. Below is the official language in the course handbook surrounding technology and dual credit course work:

Dual credit courses and other alternative programming offered by Bushnell-Prairie City CUSD #170 in conjunction with another institution may require the use of a computer other than the standard-issue Chromebook provided by B-PC.

B-PC is not responsible for supporting platforms associated with dual credit or alternative programming, nor is it responsible for the purchase of compatible devices and/or applications. Be advised that specific hardware and/or software and internet access may be required or recommended for some courses.
